

Wireless Internet Access Policy

The library provides free, unsecured, wireless Internet access for public use, but cannot guarantee uninterrupted service.

Those who would like to access the Internet via our wireless network must have their own personal mobile devices, which are equipped with a wireless card and set to obtain an IP address automatically, with no proxy server settings.

Library staff is able to provide only limited technical assistance and may not be able to troubleshoot connection problems.

The library assumes no responsibility for patron equipment or software and cannot guarantee the security of files or transmissions.

The library upholds the rights and responsibility of parents and legal guardians to guide, determine, and monitor their children's use of the library's network. As with other library materials, monitoring of a child's access to the Internet is the responsibility of the parent or legal guardian. The Library is not responsible for enforcing any restrictions which a parent or guardian may place on a minor's use of this resource.

The range of the wireless network covers the entire library. Patrons are not restricted as to where (within the library) they may chose to use a personal mobile device, and will be asked to move only if they are causing a disturbance or are interfering with library programming.

The library does not provide access to our network printer for those using a personal mobile device, nor do we provide any physical connectivity other than an electrical outlet, when available. Patrons are not permitted to unplug any library equipment in order to plug in their personal equipment.

Please note that although the portions of the library's Public Access Internet Policy concerning library equipment do not apply to personal mobile device users, all ethical considerations do apply. A copy of this policy is available for viewing at the Circulation Desk. Wireless Internet access may not be used for unauthorized, illegal or unethical purposes. No one may send, receive, or display text or graphics that may reasonably be construed as obscene or violent. If caught purposely browsing an obscene or violent site, individuals must immediately close the Internet connection and leave the library.
